This bibliography developed at the request of those members who were recently charged with adding "Art Education" to their library collections liaison responsibilities. If you are not familiar with the field, it can be quite bewildering to track down vendors, suppliers and resources. Often this area is covered by the library that has the responsibility and collection for a school of education, i.e. a teaching resource center. But as some universities are merging units, "reorganizing" for greater productivity, some of our colleagues have had to add this field to their "fine arts library" collection. Others of you may be new to the profession and may need some assistance in identifying what materials are good to collect for study in art education for K-12. There is a wider range of formats for materials to be acquired for this area of study than for the more "academic" studies of art history or studio arts. Cataloging and storage may be a challenge for anyone new to collecting lesson plans, timelines, media, kits, realia, Web sites, posters and games for the students to use in a K-12 school setting. I set aside space for this mixed collection of formats in a secure closet with strong shelves in my visual resources library and used the VR collection location code for the library catalog system.

My library has served the art educators of the institution for nearly one hundred years, so I have access to a well-developed collection to support this field. There is also a "Teacher Resource center" in the School of Education, which is independent of the library system. They collect multiple expendable textbooks and lesson plans that the library does not want to process. Even then, as I check our library system catalog, I find that many materials used by our art education majors and faculty are split into materials held at the main campus library for the education school and at the Art Library branch for the art school. Classes are taught on both sites for these students. I have compiled a bibliography of recent and forthcoming publications as well as some fun favorites that our students like to use in student teaching. This is not an inclusive list, but a listing that may provide some examples of a variety of recent and promising forthcoming publications, which I hope you will find useful, that cover the range of materials needed for study in the field. For this field, the library collects materials geared for the educators/ teachers and for the students, by grade level K-12. I could not have compiled this bibliography without the expert assistance of Mrs. Ashley Coutts, Herron alumna and art teacher at Shelbyville Middle School, Shelbyville, Indiana. I am most grateful for her advice and assistance.
