Berry, S.L. *For the Sake of Art: the History of the Indianapolis Art Center* Indianapolis: Indianapolis Art Center, c.1999. History of the local art center, founded in 1934, that specializes in art education for the amateur adult and younger students. Url: [www.indplsartcenter.org](http://www.indplsartcenter.org)

Boomhower, Ray E. *But I do Clamor: May Wright Sewall, A Life, 1844-1920*. Zionsville: Guild Press of Indiana, c. 2001. Biography of the leading patroness of the arts in Indianapolis in the late 19<sup>th</sup> century who headed the Art Association of Indianapolis (1883 incorporated) into founding the John Herron Art Institute in 1902 and established art education, particularly for women.

Catlin-Legutko, Cinnamon. *The Art of Healing: The Wishard Art Collection*. With essays by Katherine C. Nagler and Hester Anne Hale. Indianapolis: Indianapolis Historical Society Press in cooperation with the Wishard Memorial Foundation, 2004. History of public art murals project in local City Hospital (now Wishard Memorial) done by Hoosier Group artists and students of J. Herron Art Institute in 1910's and later. Proceeds from book sales will help fund restoration of existing paintings and exhibition space. Early example of arts used as medical therapy in a hospital setting.

Across Indiana, #1403. Indianapolis, WFYI [television station], c.2003. Local PBS television station production series with episode portion devoted to the restoration project for the Wishard Art Collection murals and its history, artists, interviews with the author and sponsors. Wishard Memorial Hospital is now part of the IU Medical Center of IUPUI.

Ferrucci, Kate. *Limestone Lives: Voices from the Indiana Stone Belt*. Bloomington, IN: People to People Press, 2002. Industry history and biographies of Indiana stone cutters and stone carvers, local sculptors and artisans who were trained in carving limestone for the building trades over the past century. Stone carvings by these artists are all over the country.

Gray, Ralph D. *IUPUI: The Making of an Urban University*. Bloomington: Indiana University Press, c. 2003. Campus history with aggregated histories of each unit, some of which are like the University of the Arts, much older than the current institution, including the Herron School of Art, now 103 years old, renamed Herron School of Art and Design.

Greiff, Glory-June. *Remembrance, Faith, and Fancy: Outdoor Public Sculpture in Indiana*. Indianapolis: Indiana Historical Society Press, forthcoming. Book developed from research on the Save Outdoor Sculpture public art project to document all outdoor sculpture in the state. Herron sculptors are included.

Newton, Judith Vale with Carol Weiss. *Skirting the Issue: Stories of Indiana's Historical Women Artists*. Indianapolis: Indiana Historical Society Press, 2004. Biographies and bibliographies of 19<sup>th</sup> and 20<sup>th</sup>-century women artists of Indiana. Exhibition catalog with matching traveling exhibit going around the state over the next two years.

Berry and Jennifer L. Hehman. This history of the John Herron Art Institute, now the Herron School of Art and Design, was prepared to celebrate the school's centennial in 2002, includes a listing of all faculty, administrators and all students enrolled from 1902-1920, all graduates from 1920-2002 with their major awards, i.e. Prix de Rome winners, et al. It is also a fund raising tool to support the costs of the newest Herron building, Eskanazi Hall, being completed on the IUPUI campus this month.
