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ORGANIZATIONAL WEBSITES

American Academy of Women Artists. <http://aawafineart.com>

Members include women artists exhibiting at Western United States galleries and working in the following genres: Western, plein air, still life, landscape, wildlife, and contemporary sculpture.

ArtTable, Inc.: ARTTABLE. <http://www.arttable.org/>

A national membership organization for professional women in leadership positions in the visual arts. Founded in 1981, ArtTable's purpose is to promote and advance greater knowledge, understanding, and appreciation of the visual arts. The organization has a membership of 1,600 and has US chapters on the east and west coasts, and in the southwest.

ArtWomen.org. <http://www.artwomen.org>

Includes visual art and feminist cultural production across and between disciplines and geographical boundaries. Topics of interest include feminism and art, visual culture, women artists of color, feminist artists, heterosexism, current issues, gallery, news and events, and more.

Guerrilla Girls. <http://www.guerrillagirls.com/>

The Guerrilla Girls are a group of women artists and arts professionals who are active in fighting discrimination. They provide educational materials, posters, workshops, 'gigs', tours, and perform (as visiting artists) in gorilla masks to use humor to convey information and provoke discussion of feminist issues in the visual arts.

National League of American Pen Women. <http://www.americanpenwomen.org/>

Founded in 1897 for women journalists, authors, and illustrators. Membership classifications include women artists, writers, and composers. The organization, a 501 (c)(3) not-for-profit with its national headquarters in Washington, D.C., promotes development of the creative talents of professional women in the arts and consists of more than 200 local branches throughout the United States and in Panama. The League sponsors an annual juried exhibition open to women artists only, with monetary awards.

National Museum of Women in the Arts. <http://www.nmwa.org/>

The only museum in the world dedicated exclusively to recognizing the contributions of women artists. Located in Washington, D.C, it includes permanent collections, special exhibitions, educational programs, a library and research center, outreach and member services, publications, a museum shop, and a database of women artists.

The site provides a selective annotated list of links with information on women in the visual arts. Individual artists' web pages are not listed, although sites with lists of such links are included.

Founded in 1981 and reorganized in 2000 as an online resource center, Women in Photography International is an educational, nonprofit organization that serves the needs of photographers, photo educators, photography students, gallery owners, and photographic organizations around the world. In keeping with its mission, they promote the visibility of women photographers.

Women's Caucus for Art. <http://www.nationalwca.com>

Founded in 1972 in connection with the College Art Association (CAA), WCA is a national membership organization unique in its multi-disciplinary and multicultural membership of artists, art historians, students/educators, and museum professionals. The website includes information about the organization and its mission to expand opportunities and recognition for women in the arts.

A section of "Artyclopedia" indexing online works by over 850 women artists represented at online museum sites, image archives, and other online resources.

An Internet networking project originally established to be presented at the United Nations Fourth World Conference on Women in 1995 in Beijing, China. The site currently has images and information on approximately 1,000 professional women artists from over 64 countries.

Australian Women's Art Register. <http://www.womensartregister.org/womar1.htm>

Established in 1975, the register is an archive and repository of slides, unpublished material, and other written sources, documenting Australian women artists, their art practice, images, and writings. Publications, resources, and research links to the National Library of Australia (Pandora Archive) are available. Educational materials and kits offered.

A meta site with links to feminist/women's art Internet sites worldwide. Last updated November 2006.
